Upon leaving your reservation, you may receive a call back asking you to reschedule your reservation to accommodate staffing.

MARK MANO



Mark was born September 29, 1941 (he will celebrate his 80th birthday this month) to Rudy and Helen (Commodore) Mano, one of three boys (brothers, Barry, and Greg - deceased June 2013).

Mark graduated from St Catherine's High School in 1959 and joined the US Navy in September, serving two years active duty and another four years in the reserves, being honorably discharged in 1965. According to Mark, he attended UW-Racine in 1961 and 62 attended but, "flunked out." Mark went back to UW-Parkside in 1969 and graduated in 1971 with a degree in Business Marketing. During his hiatus Mark worked at Young Radiator (1962-1965) and started as a professional drag racer in dragsters (Mano Bros. Racine) in 1962, as a driver with his brother Barry as the mechanic, the venture ended in 1969.

In 1961 Mark refereed his first JV basketball game at East Troy High School, getting paid \$5.00 cash, with his dad working the varsity game. In 1970 the NBA was looking for 5 new officials and selected 100 officials from around the country to attend a tryout camp in Chicago. Basketball Hall of Fame Referee Mendy Rudolph was the boss. Mark was selected to work his first exhibition game (Pistons v. Knicks) on September 24, 1970, in Ann Arbor, Mi. Mark stayed in the league for five years working 82 games a season. He said one of his most memorable games was December 12, 1972 (Bulls v. Lakers in Chicago). He told me to Google it, which I did (Exciting overtime victory by the Lakers – 106 to 105). During the NBA summers Mark taught referees in San Juan, Puerto Rico, traveling all over the island, often working games on outdoor courts and many times having a police escort to get back to his apartment safely.

In 1976 Mark and his brother Barry started a new magazine aimed at improving officiating in all sports, Referee Magazine, staying for one year. Referee magazine still thrives today. During 1976 Mark worked part-time with his dad at Mano Fencing, doing a few fences a week. Having gotten remarried and adopting three children (Bill, Corrine, and Chuck) Mark began selling cars at Frank Gentile Olds and Honda. Joe Jardina and Augie Stretti were his mentors. One Friday night Augie suggested going to Roma Lodge after work for a card game, they went to Memorial Drive and played to the wee hours of the morning. Mark met Mike Gallo, Emil and Gino Infusino, and a few others and played cards many years together and formed friendships which still exist. In 1979 Augie wanted to sponsor Mark to join the lodge which has translated into 42 years of membership.

In 1977 Mark received a call that a women's pro basketball league was forming and was asked if he wanted to work the first game. Mark said yes and threw the ball up for the Milwaukee Does and the Chicago Hustle, starting a two-year stay. During this period a friend Davy Phillips, an American League Umpire and assignor, approached Mark about working D1 basketball. Three-man basketball refereeing was just getting started and Mark accepted, working 7 conferences, and refereeing 85 games a year. During this period Mark, his father and brother were schooled in three men officiating. They took games to demonstrate the new mechanics, which took a while to take hold.

During his college career he was fortunate to return to San Juan to work the San Juan Shoot Out College tournament. From there he was asked to go to the island of Antigua to teach referees for two weeks. In 1988 Mark took over assigning small college referees for two conferences, Lake Michigan and Midwest Conference, where he stayed until 1993. With all the headaches of assigning, working 85 games annually and the travel Mark was burning out, so he decided to step down working his last game at Lakeland College for a NAIA tournament berth. Mark's career ended when he put his bag in the closet and never touched a whistle again.



Mano Fencing had grown a lot and Mark worked at the business from 4:00 AM until about 6:00 PM, loading 5 trucks every day with the forklift and doing estimates. During an 8-month season they handled about 1,000 jobs. Mark sold the business in 2000 to his son Chuck who continues to move the company forward. Two of Chuck's children, Zach and Samantha also work in the business. Chuck and Zach became Lodge members June of 2021, making Mark a proud dad and grandpa.

In 2000 Mark moved fulltime to Kissimmee Florida to start a new life. Mark found a Catholic Church about three miles away; it seemed his higher power had some new ventures for him. Back in Wisconsin in the summer of 2000 he started attending daily mass at St. Louis before estimating fences. He said he had forgotten about his higher power for some years, and he then reconnected. At one of those summer daily masses the priest, Father Jerry Hessell, came to Mark before mass and asked him to be the lector that day. As Mark stated, he gave him all the reasons why not, but Father didn't waiver. Mark has been reading ever since and found a new passion, having read in 19 churches to date. Mark also took Eucharistic Minister training. In Florida Mark attended daily Mass at a 1,500-family parish where he was asked, he if he could lead the once-a-week kid's mass. The pastor wanted to know if he had the time to be the church sacristan, to which Mark said, "What is that??" He learned it was a person who organizes the masses in the church and did the funerals, naturally he said yes and stayed for 5 years and did 297 funerals. During this 5-year period Mark was introduced to Give Kids the World, a local resort run by the Make-A-Wish foundation. This was an option for terminally children granted a final wish. Mark went there one day in early 2000 to see the resort and meet with management. At that time, he was fishing 200 days a year and they told him "We have a pond stocked with fish" and no one to run a weekly fishing contest. Mark fixed all their equipment, and every Tuesday for 5 years held a two-hour Catch and Release contest. Mark said his heart was broken many times dealing with these kids, but he never allowed himself to show it. When they caught a bass, Mark told them "Down here we kiss our fish on the mouth before we release them." Mark said he thought their parents thought he was nuts, but admits they were right.

Mark continues to do what he can to help people by donating whole blood and platelets, to date he is a 65-gallon donor.

In 2001, Mark was introduced to tournament cribbage, playing three clubs weekly and on some weekends, he would travel by car or air to weekend tournaments in the Carolinas and Northeast. There were usually between 100 and 150 players on a weekend and Mark has been so fortunate to have won 5 of them. This is why Pam and Mark decided to run monthly tournaments at our Lodge. One Sunday a month starting 12 September this year. They are fun and very sociable games. See the ad in this newsletter.

In 2002 Mark met Pam Lopez on Yahoo Personals, they dated and moved together to Montgomery, Alabama in 2005 for Pam's pursuit of a job in the auto auction business. Mark took care of a 19-acre Catholic Church, grass cutting and organizing work crews. The pastor gave him a credit card and said do what you need too, nobody had ever spent the time needed to beautify the grounds. After two years Mark & Pam returned to Florida and stayed until July of 2016. They wanted to be around family and friends back in Wisconsin, so they bought a condo in Sturtevant. Pam and Mark got married on December 11, 2020, which Mark describes as the best day of his life, marrying his soulmate.

March 2020 saw COVID change our lives and Mark approached the lodge about saving a ton of money and doing the grass cutting and landscaping ourselves. Frank Bisotti brought over a 48" garden tractor that was used that year to cut the grass. Mark has devoted a lot of time to the lawn care, but he says he loves to cut grass. He is thankful to the members eager to help trim trees, plant flowers and lay mulch. Through Mark's efforts we now have a zero-turn lawn mower, trimmers, and all the tools we need. Mark describes it as a labor of love by all the men and women who have seen fit to help. Mark feels he is a blessed man to have you all in his life!




Roma Lodge Golf Outing






